NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR 1944

THE Eighth Annual Meeting of the Association was held on the 18th February, 1944, in the Archæological Museum, Downing Street, by kind permission of the Curator. The President, the Master of Magdalene, took the chair, supported by the Patron, Lord Fairhaven, and Mr. Barnard, Mrs. Keynes and Ald. Peck, Vice-Presidents. In the absence of the Hon. Secretary and Treasurer through illness, Ald. Peck read the minutes of the Seventh Annual Meeting; these were confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

The Chairman welcomed Lord Fairhaven on his first appearance at an Annual Meeting as Patron. He said that the Association was very fortunate in having at its head so keen an enthusiast in all matters of antiquarian and local interest. Lord Fairhaven said that he felt it to be a privilege to follow the late Mr. Adeane in work which was entirely after his own heart.

The Chairman presented the Report and Accounts for the year 1943. These were adopted on the motion of the Patron, seconded by Mrs. Keynes, whom all present were delighted to welcome. The retiring officers, the General Committee, and Elected Members of the Executive Committee were re-elected en bloc for the year 1944.

The Acting Hon. Curator, Mr. R. C. Lambeth, continued his lecture of last year on "The Exhibits in the Cambridge Folk Museum," illuminated by slides. This was greatly appreciated and a hearty vote of thanks accorded to the Lecturer.

Nine years have passed since the opening of the Museum, and we are in the sixth year of the war. It is perhaps remarkable that in 1944 more gifts came to the Museum than in 1943, some of them of outstanding interest and all worth preserving as illustrating a mode of life which will probably never be seen again. The Children's Room, which must now contain one of the most complete collections of its kind, received a fully trimmed doll's cradle from Mrs. M. D. Bradford, a child's rush-seated chair from Miss M. Borrer and a child's walk from Messrs. W. Stockbridge & Son, Ltd. Col. Foster gave a fine pair of percussion lock duelling pistols. An interesting gift from Ald. W. B. Beales was a Cambridge High Constable's Long Staff, inscribed "Stephen Thrower, Mayor, 1834." (Note the thrown 7). A pair of tinsel pictures and a musical box came from the late Mr. A. W.


Barker. Another fine musical box was given by the Patron. We were glad to accept from Mr. W. J. Taylor the Linton Town fire hooks; we already have the hook of St. Peter's Parish.

Two more exhibitions were staged at Linton Village College with the enthusiastic collaboration of the Warden, Mr. E. Swannell, and Dr. W. Downs. One illustrated the evolution of lighting from rush-lights to electricity. The other covered the realm of cooking. A large open fire place was built and equipped with all the gadgets and laboursaving devices (for this is really what they were) of about 200 years ago. Both these were much appreciated not only by the pupils of the Village College but by many visitors from the surrounding villages.

The Curator was able to find time to give several talks, illustrated by Lantern Slides, to the A.T.S., who maintained their interest in the Museum, Village Colleges and Youth Clubs. All these were much enjoyed and spread the knowledge of the Museum very widely.

The Accounts for 1944 again show slightly increased receipts at the Museum. The paid attendance increased by 278. The total attendance was 4,439: 2,673 paid and 1,766 came on free days. We have now sold out the stock of Mr. Lambeth's two pamphlets and unfortunately are not able to get them reprinted. Grants were again received from the Borough and County Education Authorities and the Thomas Wall Trust. The Committee is grateful for this continued help. Subscriptions were slightly down for the year and less was received in donations. It must again be emphasised that the accounts were only balanced by special donations from a Vice-President and the Cambridge Antiquarian Society. The Committee earnestly asks members to speak of the Museum to their friends and to make every effort to obtain more subscribers. The financial basis upon which the Museum rests is at present too narrow for the edifice which we have been able to build upon it. We have a fine collection of exhibits; many of outstanding interest, some unique. The visible contents of the Museum are less than one half of the total collection, the rest is stored awaiting an opportunity of showing it to the public. All this means that we must face the problem of extension after the war both of premises and financial resources.

The Committee wish to remind members that the Museum is open on Sundays from 2.30-4.30, and on week-days, except Monday, from 2 o'clock to 4.30 p.m.
