the ensuing year.

A meeting of the Executive Committee was held at 5.0. p.m. on Sept 17. 1937 at the Museum of Archaeology and Ethnology. There were present:-

Mr E. S. Wallerstein (President, in the Chair), Mr. Keyes, Dr. J. D. Smith, Mrs Palmer, Dr. Cobbold, Messrs Barnard, Cadoux & Saltmarsh, with the Hon Sec & Treasurer (Dr. H. Robinson) & the Custodian. Delegates for absent were received from Mrs Parsons (Hon Curator) & Messrs Bakers, Hughes, Surfe & Thobolt.

* The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed. Arising out of the minutes the President

- Hon Secretary reported:-

(a) That some contribution ^{would} be forthcoming from the University Summer School, the Museum having been included in the list of institutions recommended to be visited.

(b) That Dr. Norman Dixon of the Pitt Rivers had promised to renew the old printing from four documents & Jagg's promises to the museum.

(c) That Major Triggs Walker had been invited to accept election as a member of the Committee & his reply was awaited.

(d) That the leakage from the roof had been remedied by the Town Council

(e) That a letter had been addressed to the Town Clerk asking (1) that the adjoining premises, No 3 Castle Street, might be transferred to the Museum, (2) that the lighting of the stable might be improved and (3) that two old carved oak beams found on the Guildhall site during demolition (possibly belonging to the Old Guildhall of 1386) may be loaned to the Museum.

The Hon Curator (whose absence due to indisposition was regretted by the Committee) sent a written report (attached) which included the following points

1. Some 136 new objects had been received since the previous meeting
2. D Scruby had rendered valuable service in connection with the candlestick
3. Since December, 910 children had visited the Museum in 41 groups, including 657 from the Borough Schools, 135 from the County School for Girls, 87 from the Perse Schools, & 31 students from the Saffron Walden Training College. The report included

criticism of the conduct of the children, with suggestions for improved procedure. After discussion the following resolutions were carried :-

1. That the Cambridge Branch of the National Union of Teachers be invited to nominate one of their members whom the Exec. Cllr could co-opt as a member. (Proposer, Ald. Corder, Seconded Dr. Barnard)
2. That the Officers, with Ald. Corder (Chairman of the Bournville Education Clr.) consider the points raised by the Curator, especially the limitation of numbers in visiting groups and of the number of rooms visited & Professor Dr. Keynes, Seconded D. Palmer)

The acquisition of an old chest inscribed with the name of John Purchare Mayor in 1818 was also reported. D. Cobbit undertook to photograph a waffon

Various members of the Committee Board promised to approach Colleges personally, a much more full letter of appeal which was about to be issued to 9 Colleges which had not yet given financial support.

A meeting of the Executive Committee was held at 5.30 p.m. on Dec. 10th 1937 at the Museum of Archaeology & Ethnology. There were present:-

An apology for absence was received from Mr Baker.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read & confirmed. On the motion of the members the President & the Hon. Secretary reported:-

(a) That Major Jiffes-Walker had accepted co-chairmanship of the Committee or had become an ordinary annual subscriber

(b) That the Cambridge Borough Traders Ass' had nominated Miss T. Chapman as their representative & that the Ass' had become an ordinary member of the Folk Museum Association.

On being put to the meeting the co-chairman of Miss Chapman was carried unanimously

- (c) That Dr Cobbe had photographed a former wagon referred to him but was unable to recommend its acquisition.
- (d) That a further appeal to the Colleges had resulted as follows:-

Clerk, Peterhouse, Sidney Sussex - life membership
Corpus Christi - Ordinary membership with five
years subscription paid in advance

Pembroke Ordinary membership.

Christ's - no subscriber, but exhibits presented.

No response - Trinity Hall, Jesus, Selwyn.

Dr Barnard drew attention to some wagons at Isleham, & Dr Denby undertook to give the master attention if opportunity should arise.

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The Hon Curator reported on recent acquisitions, & stated that there were now 1550 objects in the Museum. Dr Denby had nearly finished the index. The general valuation for insurance purposes was raised & it was agreed that Mr Cattley be approached. The President gave information about the old Gudhall carved beams.

The offer of a ^{wooden} stone box by a Willingham miller was reported and Mayor T. J. J. Walker undertook to look into the matter.

The Hon Treasurer made a statement on the financial position, of which the principal features were:-

The Treasurer further reported that applications for Grants to the Pelpine Trust & to the National Council for Social Service had been unproductive.

The Hon Sec. presented the recommendations of the Special Cllr. which had been considered the question of the attendance of Borough School children at the Museum together with appreciative reports by the Teachers. It was resolved: ~~to recommend~~

1. That parties be limited to half a class, the

Teachers to be assisted by a volunteer with special knowledge of the Museum contents.

2. The age to be older & upwards
3. Attention at each visit to be limited to a special subject
4. Teachers to be strongly recommended to visit the Museum beforehand & familiarise themselves with the exhibits.
5. Teachers to be informed that afternoon visits would be preferable from the point of view of the general management of the Museum.

A suggested examination & prize were referred to the Teachers' representative (Mr Chapman) for report.

The Hon Society reported the receipt of a letter from the Town Clerk stating that the Town Council have agreed in principle to No 3 Castle Street being added the Museum & asking for particulars as to alterations considered to be needed.

~~Alt Keeper~~ Mr Keyes & Ald^r Cader Heflow with the Surveyor Officers were appointed as a Sub Committee with power to report to the Town Council

The date of the next' meeting of the Council was
fixed for January 21st.

A meeting of the Executive Committee was held at the
Museum of Archaeology & Ethnology at 5.0 p.m. on Friday,
Jan 21st, 1938. There were present:-

The President (Dr Saurle Peke) in the chair, Mr C E Parsons
Administrator, Mr M. O'Reilly, Dr Symonds, Mr T Chapman,
Sir Palmer & Cobbe, Mrs Barnard, LCG Clarke, ^{Dr Newman} WD
Swift, Mr Tipp Walker, J Saltmarsh, Mr Cader, Sir Holman
& the Custodian.

An apology for absence was received from Mr Baker.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and
confirmed.

During the reading of the minutes the President reported that
he had interviewed Mr H D Cather, who was giving the
Guerkin of valuation for insurance purposes his consideration.
Mr Tipp Walker reported that he had acquired the wooden
stone millstone from a Willingham miller for the Museum
per cent. Further information was also given regarding
the carved beams from the old Eynesbury almshouse.
Sir Palmer had written an illustrated note
published in the Cambridge Daily News.

The President further reported regarding an old fellow in the Trumpton police lockup & it was agreed that he should approach Mr Penberton with a view to its acquisition. He also drew attention to two table wares on sale by Queen Rose towards the purchase of which Dr Rose had offered a subscription of £1.1.0, and it was resolved that the Hon Curator be authorised to examine the ware & report.

The Hon Curator reported that there were now 1604 articles in the Museum, & gave particulars of new acquisitions. It was agreed that military uniforms be accepted, provided that they are of local corps. Reference was also made to the Custodian. The report was received.

It was further agreed that steps be taken to acquire two fireplaces, to go with a painted panel of which attention was drawn by the Cambridge Antiquarian Society, from property on Stow Hill belonging to Stow's Chantry.

The Hon Sec. & Treasurer presented a financial

statement of which the following were the salient features

The Treasurer drew attention to the fact that if the policy approved with regard to life memberships subscriptions for 1936 were followed for 1937 the end-balance would be converted into a deficit of approximately £ 30. On the motion of Mr. Alder Condie, seconded by Mr. Clarke it was resolved that the same as advised by the auditor for 1936 be followed for 1937.

The Hon. Treasurer further reported that the Bondy Education Club had resolved to give a further frank

of £10 for the year 1938 if the facilities for
the admission of school children were still available,
it was resolved that the Education Secretary's letter
be answered in the affirmative.

Arising out of this a report by Lewis Chapman to the
effect that the Cambridge Branch Teachers Association had
disapproved the suggested examination & prize was
received.

The report of the Special Sub Cllr appointed to deal
with the question of extension of the museum premises
was communicated to the Cllr, and it was explained
that this was now in the hands of the Town Council,
whose decision as to the improvement proposed was
awaited.

It was agreed that the Annual General meeting
should be arranged for March 9th or 11th, and on
the motion of Mr Saltmarsh seconded by Lewis Parsons
it was resolved that Miss Grant be asked to
give an address on her Folk Museum experience
in Scotland.

The date of a special meeting of the Executive Cllr to consider the draft annual report was fixed for Feb 11th.

It was agreed on the motion of Mr Barnard that a numerical return of visitors to the Museum be included in the annual report.

It was agreed on the proposition of Mr Cadzow that the County Education Cllr be approached for a grant on a basis similar to that for the admission of Burgh School children.

It was moved by Mr D. J. Walker, seconded by Mr O'Reilly, or carried, that the new Curator of the Museum of Archaeology & Ethnology (Mr T. T. Paterson, M.A) be elected a member of the Cllr.

A special meeting of the Executive Committee was held at the Museum of Archaeology & Ethnology at 5 o'clock on Friday 11th 1938. Members present:-

The President (C. S. Barlow Peck, in the Chair) Miss Catherine S. Parsons, Dr C. T. Abbott, Dr. M. O'Reilly, Dr. Sykes-Walker, Dr. H. Sculby, Dr. W. T. Sargeant, Dr. John Saltmarsh, Dr. E. A. B. Barnard, Dr. J. Chapman and Mrs. Viegas & the Hon. Secy & Tres.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Apologies for absence were received from Dr. Baker, Dr. Cobbold & Dr. Palmer.

It was reported that Dr. T. T. Patterson had consented to join the Executive Club.

Amongst the minutes

(at the President's report) that he had consulted Mr. Catling, who considered that the most satisfactory manner in which to deal with the question of insurance of the museum contents would be to get a professional appraiser to value the articles, too lists to be prepared, one of

which should be sent to the Fire Insurance Co. for their approval. The President undertook to get tenders.

(b) The President reported that Mr. Pemberton had agreed to present the pillow in the Thompson police lock-up to the Museum.

(c) The Hon. Curator reported that she had been informed it had been offered in Dr. Ross's possession, and that the police had taken no action. She recommended no further action. The President undertook to see Dr. Ross about his offer of \$1.00 towards the purchase price.

(d) Miss O'Reilly stated that the Cambridge Antislavery Society was awaiting the decision of Mr. Storey's Church regarding certain objects in Rev. Huntington's property.

~~Miss~~ The Hon. Curator reported that Miss Bowen had kindly undertaken to do certain work on objects at the Museum.

The draft Annual report was considered and

after amendment; was approved for presentation to the Annual General Meeting, with the addition of a statement by the Hon. Curator, to be agreed by the President.

Arrangements for the Annual General Meeting on March 4th were approved, and it was agreed to recommend the re-election of Patron or President, or of the General Committee with the addition of the names of Drs Buckenham, Dr Sharp, The Lord Dartmouth, Sir Graham Greene, Dr T. T. Patterson, Dr G. H. Heffer & Dr Roger Whit; also of the Executive Cte. with the addition of Mr Patterson.

The terms of appointment & remuneration of the Curator (in Re Lambeth) were considered, and it was resolved to recommend:-

1. On the written application of Mrs Parsons seconded by Dr Scobie, that

she be the Assistant Curator

2. On the written application of Mrs Keyes

that her salary be £110 p.a.
