### ORDER OF SERVICE

- The Choir and Clergy with the Chancellor and the Bishop shall proceed from the Vestry by way of Blinco Grove to the Church gate on Hills Road. When they arrive OUTSIDE the Church porch, the files will step two feet apart to enable the Bishop, preceded by the Vicar, the Chancellor and Churchwardens to get to the west door.
- The Bishop, attended by his Chancellor, is received at the entrance of the Church by the Minister, the Churchwardens and others. A Petition is delivered to the Minister by Mr. W. R. Elworthy, Hon. Sec. of the Building Committee. The Minister prays the Bishop to Consecrate the Extension of the Church.

The Bishop receives the Petition, directs the Registrar to read the same, and signifies his consent to Consecrate the Church, according to the prayer of the Petitioners.

Then shall the Choir, the Clergy and procession reform, and the Bishop, with the Churchwardens, proceed towards the Holy Table.

¶ When the Choir arrives at the Chancel the Twentyfourth Psalm shall be sung.

The Bishop and his Chaplains shall go to the Holy Table, and the Bishop, SITTING IN HIS CHAIR, shall receive from the person appointed THE DEED OF CONVEYANCE, Donation, or Endowment. The Bishop SHALL LAY THE SAME UPON THE HOLY TABLE: then, going to the East end of the New Extension, turning to the people, he shall say:

Dearly beloved in the Lord, forasmuch as devout and holy men, as well under the Law as under the Gospel, moved either by the secret inspiration of the Holy Spirit, or by express command of God, or by their own reason and sense of the order and decency of things, have erected Houses for the public worship of God, and separated them from all profane and common uses, in order to fill men's minds with greater reverence for His glorious Majesty, and to affect their hearts with more devotion and humility in His service; which pious works have been approved and graciously accepted by our heavenly Father: let us not doubt but He will also graciously approve our godly purpose of setting apart this Extension, in a solemn manner, to the performance of the several offices of religious worship; and let us faithfully and devoutly beg His blessing on this our undertaking.

#### Then, all kneeling, the Bishop shall say :

O eternal God, mighty in power, and of majesty incomprehensible, whom the heaven of heavens cannot contain, much less the walls of temples made with hands, and who yet hast been graciously pleased to promise Thy special presence in whatever place even two or three of Thy faithful servants shall assemble in Thy Name to offer their supplications and their praises to Thee; Vouchsafe, O Lord, to be now present with us, who are gathered here together to consecrate this Extension, with all humility and readiness of heart, to the honour of Thy great Name, separating it henceforth from all unhallowed, ordinary, and common uses, dedicating it to Thy service for hearing therein Thy most holy Word, for offering to Thy glorious Majesty the sacrifice of prayer and thanksgiving, and for performing all other holy ordinances which may be lawfully used and solemnised therein. Accept, O Lord, this service at our hands, and bless it with such success as may promote Thy glory, and the salvation of Thy people; through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

¶ Then shall the Bishop, proceeding to the Font, and turning his face towards the Congregation, who continue kneeling, say:

Regard, O Lord, the supplications of Thy servants, and grant that whosoever shall be dedicated unto Thee in this house by baptism, may be sanctified by Thy Holy Spirit, delivered from Thy wrath, received into the ark of Christ's Church, and ever remain among the number of Thy faithful and elect children. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, that they who in this place shall, in their own persons, renew the promises and vows made by their sureties for them at their baptism, and thereupon shall be confirmed by the Bishop, may be strengthened by the Holy Ghost the Comforter, and being defended with Thy heavenly grace, may continue Thine for ever, and daily increase in Thy Holy Spirit more and more, until they come unto Thy everlasting Kingdom. Amen.

Grant, we beseech Thee, blessed Lord, that whosoever shall draw near unto Thee in this place, to give Thee thanks for the great benefits they have received at Thy hands, to set forth Thy most worthy praise, to confess their sins unto Thee, and to ask such other things as are requisite and necessary as well for the body as the soul, may draw near with such steadfastness of faith, seriousness of attention, and devout affection of the mind, that Thou mayest accept their bounden duty and service, and vouchsafe to them whatsoever in Thy infinite wisdom Thou shalt see to be most expedient for them; and this we beg for Jesus Christ His sake, our blessed Lord and Saviour. Amen.

The Bishop being seated, the Sentence of Consecration shall be read by the Chancellor or Registrar. The Bishop shall then sign the Sentence, and direct that it be preserved among the muniments of the Diocese.
