## **Shirley School – 1950s & 1960s**

## Details from the Log Book 12.

#### Overview

The school opened on 19 September 1932. The Log Book was found during the relocation of Shirley Infants School from its original site in Green End Road to the site it now occupies in Nuffield Road when, on the closure of St Andrew's Junior School 31/08/2006, it became Shirley Primary School.

The Log Book provides school activities as follow

When is opened in 1932 children were transferred from the Infant section of St Andrew which then became a Junior School.

1957 saw celebrations for the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the opening which are recorded in the Log Book.

#### Oct 23rd 1950


