

Norfolk Street Bakery Café & Shop 7 Station Road CB1 2JB

A four minute walk along Station Road from Cambridge Main Railway Station.

Reality Checkpoint Parker's Piece CB1 1PN

'Cricket's Most Famous Soccer And Cricket Pavilion ~ Rule Set Uniformly'





Turn right onto Hills Road and continue walking until you have the Roman Catholic church on your left. Turn right and cross to the centre of Parker's Piece (the birthplace of the rules of association football) to the lamppost known as Reality Checkpoint.

The Box Café 47 Norfolk Street CB1 2LD

Follow the right-hand path to the start of East Road. Walk for about 200m to the second pedestrian crossing. Cross over East Road at this spot and move directly into Norfolk Street. You'll find The Box Café a short distance along on the right.

The Old Norfolk Street Bakery 89 Norfolk Street CB1 2LD

Only a few moments further along Norfolk Street brings you to the inviting window display of mouth-watering cakes and pastries of this talented baker.

Hot Numbers Coffee 5/6 Dale's Brewery Gwydir Street CB1 2LJ



'People all round approve,

This well-run business uplifts and does good,

Continue along Norfolk Street to its junction with Gwydir Street. Turn right into Gwydir Street and walk its length until you approach Mill Road (ten minute walk). Just there you'll see the Dale's Brewery Building, and Hot Numbers on the ground floor.

Mill Road Railway Bridge 133½ Mill Road CB1 2BQ

Now it's only a short walk over the railway bridge: gateway to the famous Romsey Town and The Broadway. Meet interesting characters and see lots of reminders about the history of the railway and 'Red Romsey' in this part of Cambridge.

The Barber Shop 7 The Broadway, CB1 3AH

Just after the Mill Road bridge, past the Romsey 'R' memorial, you'll be in The Broadway and next to Joe The Barber's well known, long-standing shop. Here one can sit in a cosy friendly place, have the best haircut around, and hear many local tales of Romsey Town (as this part of Cambridge is called).

Urban Larder 9 The Broadway, CB1 3AH

A few strides further and you'll arrive at this very active, goahead, rapidly developing business, where a warm welcome and comfortable environment await.

The Old Chemist Shop Antique Centre 206 Mill Road, CB1 3NF

A three minute walk on the other side of the road, and you'll come to the unmistakable unique windows of this warm friendly shop. Lots of interesting things to see and chat about with the family owners in this long established local business.

Romsey Town Post Office 240 Mill Road, CB1 3NF

Stay on the same side of the road and walk a very short distance along to this important hub for the local community. Dadhiram Chudali has been the Post Master here for a long time and is a valued person, helping people in every way possible. You'll be sure of a warm welcome.

Relevant Record Café 260 Mill Road, CB1 3NF

Nearby (~60m) further along on the same side you'll reach this extremely popular café and record shop (in an interesting and well planned comfortable setting).

Just across the road and a little further along is the very tempting "Meadows", replete with wide ranging wholesome produce.

You've reached the final leg of your journey around the pleasant, comfortable, welcoming spots of East Cambridge. A short stroll past the historic landmarks of the Salisbury Conservative Club (1891), the Romsey Labour Club (1924) (under development), and Europe's first eco friendly Mosque (and Islamic Garden) brings you to the East End of Mill Road.



The EDGE Café 351 Mill Rd, CB1 3DF

Just a little way past the Mosque brings you to this quite uniquely friendly place where you can enjoy lovely food at reasonable prices and chat with local people if you should wish to.
