Bishop Lynwal Williams was born in 1958 in Jamaica and moved to the UK at 17 to join his parents. Within two years of accepting Christ, he was

appointed a Minister for the Bibleway Church. Known for his dynamic preaching, he has served in the UK and internationally. In 1984, he became pastor of the Greater Bibleway Church in Cambridge, where he continues to serve.

Through his leadership, Bishop Williams has helped establish and support churches across Africa, Asia, and the Caribbean. His ministry has been recognised through his consecration as a Bishop and affirmation as an Apostle of Jesus Christ.



Beyond the church, his contributions include education, community initiatives, and music. He founded the 'Cambridge Advanced Technology Training' institute, which grew from ten donated computers into a respected institution offering courses in computer technology, languages, and UK university qualifications. He also established a gospel choir, which performed at the 1997 commemoration of Princess Diana's passing on Parker's Piece.

Bishop Williams remains dedicated to fostering multicultural understanding and tolerance, working to unite people of different backgrounds, nationalities, and ethnicities.
