GONVILLE AND CAIUS COLLEGE.

This College, originally Gonville Hall, was founded in 1348, by Edmund Gonville, son of Sir Nicholas Gonville. The site of the College, as well as the Name and Statutes, were altered in 1353, by William Bateman, Bishop of Norwich. In 1558, John Caius, M.D., obtained the Royal Charter, by which the former foundations were confirmed, and his own established. By this Charter the College received its present name. According to the new Statutes, the Foundation consists of a Master, 32 Fellows, and 36 Scholars. The Tancred Studentships are attached to this College.

There is also a Law Lectureship, and four Studentships for the same branch of learning.

A letter exceeding 12 oz. 1*d.* for each oz. Not prepaid, double these rates.

STOUT POST CARDS, which bear a ½*d.* impressed stamp, may be obtained at all Post Offices, price 8*d.* for 12 ; thin ditto, 7*d.* for 12. The *address only* must appear on the front ; the communication must be written or printed on the back.

BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS.—A *Book Packet* may contain paper or other substance in ordinary use for writing or printing, photographs when not on glass, or in frames containing glass, also circulars (to the exclusion of letters, sealed or open, or anything which is sealed or closed to inspection) ; and such books, &c., may be printed, written, or plain. The postage is ½*d.* for every 2 oz. or fraction of 2 oz., to be prepaid by stamps. *Newspapers*, whether posted singly or in a packet, ½*d.* each ; but a packet containing two or more *registered* newspapers is not charged at a higher rate than a book packet. Not prepaid, double these rates. Every packet to be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends ; but the packet may be tied at the ends.

REGISTERED LETTERS.—A Letter, Book, or other Packet, on which the postage has been prepaid in Stamps, can be Registered to any part of the United Kingdom for a fee of Fourpence. The times for Registration are stated in the above Table, headed "Despatch of Letters," &c. Upon payment of a late fee of Fourpence in addition to the ordinary Registration Fee, Letters, whether Inland, Foreign, or Colonial, may be Registered after the hour specified, until the closing of the Letter Box for each despatch, or until the Office is closed for the night. Means are taken for tracing all Registered Letters ; and no Letter containing Money or other valuable Article may be sent unless it be Registered.

ORDINARY BUSINESS.

The Cambridge Office is opened to the Public for ordinary Business at 7 a.m. It is always closed at 10 p.m. On Sunday the Office is open only from 7 a.m. till 10 a.m., but the Letter Box remains open as on other days.

TELEGRAPH BUSINESS
